Educational Initiative:

The KLA Education and Outreach program is in the process of planning a Keoka Lake community event to be held at Keoka Beach Campground in 2014. Early plans include group training on Invasive Plant Boat Inspections, a youth program demonstration of the "Sebago to Waterford Watershed Run-off" children's workshop, a Loon Safety and Educational Awareness Workshop and a Boating Safety Workshop. CBI:

Thanks to the support of the Town of Waterford and a grant from Maine DEP, the Courtesy Boat Inspection (CBI) program operates with paid inspectors each weekend beginning Memorial Day as well as the week of the 4th of July. When the paid inspectors return to college in mid-to late August, the KLA board and other volunteers attempt to cover weekends through mid-September. Despite another wet spring/early summer, CBIs inspected for a total of 417.5 hours in 2013, an increase of 5% over 2012. If you would like to be trained as a CBI or would

like to attend the 2014 Milfoil Summit (scheduled for early March 2014), please let a board member know or watch the website for further information on sign-ups.

LakeSmart:

Due to budget reductions, the Maine Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) was no longer able to support the LakeSmart program this year. The program was transferred to the Maine Lakes Society, a non-profit lakes umbrella organization that selected Keoka as a pilot lake. During the summer of 2013, five inspections were conducted and three LakeSmart designations were awarded. Keoka continues to strive toward our goal of having over 30% of the lakefront properties inspected. If you would like your property reviewed in 2014, please contact Charlie Tarbell.

Plant Patrol:

In an effort to create greater awareness as well as providing a consistent survey of the plant life in Keoka Lake, this year, the lake was divided into sections. Currently, there are 11 volunteer plant patrollers who monthly 'inspect' their assigned section of

the lake for any changes in flora (pondweed, duck weed, etc) and fauna (fish, Chinese Mystery Snails, etc). Arthur Jacobson attended the Invasive Plant Workshop put on by the VLMP and became a certified patroller. Currently, two patrollers are monitoring two sections and one patroller is monitoring the section from the boat ramp to the east end of Keoka Beach Campground. In 2014, KLA is looking for additional volunteers to help with this ongoing project. Monthly monitoring can easily be done while enjoying a relaxing morning or afternoon on the lake. In addition, at the 2014 Annual Meeting, KLA will be making laminated Plant Identification cards available to members expressing an interest. Volunteering

For over 42 years, KLA has been doing what it does with a committed group of volunteers. Volunteers serve on the Board of Trustees of KLA; they serve as plant inspectors that check a section of the lake on a regular basis to assess unusual flora or fauna activity; they monitor water quality; they maintain and set up/store the loon nest; assist with merchandising spreading the KLA word at Community Breakfasts, the 4th of July parade & the Fall Foliage Race; they serve as volunteer Courtesy Boat Inspectors and they serve as liaisons to the Town of Waterford, LEA and other state organizations through direct contact or through service as a committee or board member. KLA would not be what it is without those who volunteer. Would you like to join us?
